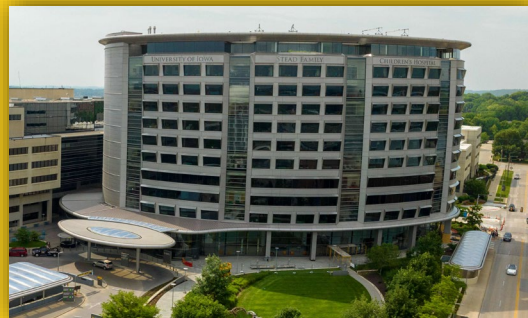


Pediatric Pain & Palliative Care Annual Conference: *Embracing the Challenge of Complex Conversations*

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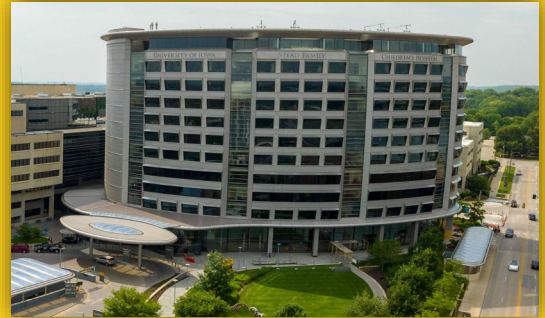
