GENERAL INFORMATION

Purpose: This conference is designed to help surgeons increase their medical knowledge and practice performance regarding surgical care.

Intended Audience: The intended audience for this conference includes general surgeons, surgical residents, and medical students. Surgeons of other subspecialties, primary care physicians, physician-extenders and nurses may also find the content of the conference very useful.

Educational Objectives: Upon completion of this conference, the learner should be able to:

- Describe challenges of surgical care and ethical concerns for premature infants.
- Discuss training needs for rural general surgeons and advantages/disadvantages for practicing surgery in a rural setting.
- Describe risk factors for fistula development, wound management, and closure techniques.
- List important aspects of surgical management for congenital heart disease.
