- Describe key challenges in transitioning from fellowship to independent extraction practice.
- Implement risk mitigation strategies to improve procedural safety.
- Outline essential components required to establish a lead extraction program

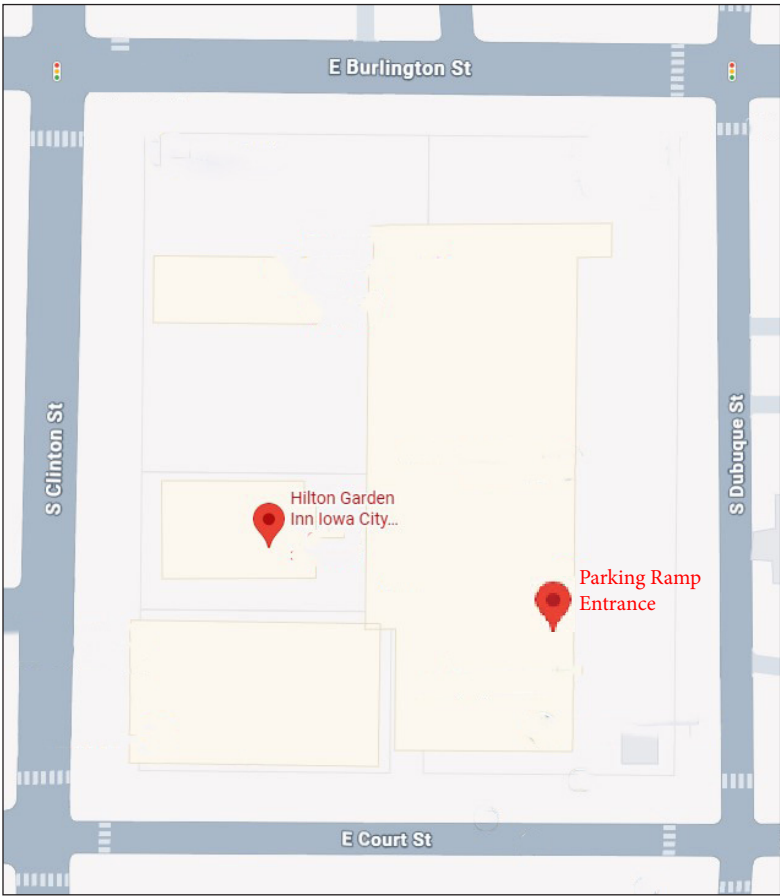
