



2023 Advanced Fetal Heart Monitoring Dates:

January 31 (Virtual); May 31; August 2, September 12; December 13

Location: 8770JPP, UI Hospitals & Clinics, Iowa City, IA

Audience: This course is designed for clinicians who have a minimum of 6 months

of clinical practice using fetal heart monitoring in their care of intrapartum patients, previously completed a formal basic or

foundation fetal heart monitoring course, and current experience using

fetal monitoring technology in their intrapartum clinical settings.

Purpose: The Advanced FHM course conveys the application of advanced fetal heart monitoring knowledge and skills.

Description: This 1-day instructor-led course is designed to prepare clinicians to care for patients with complex fetal heart monitoring tracings.

Course components include:

- Complex case studies that include recommended interventions
- Communicating with colleagues
- Advanced principles of maternal-fetal physiology
- Optional online post-test is available (required for UIHC staff)

Nursing Credits: Participants who attend the full day of the course are awarded seven (7) hours of continuing nursing education (CNE) credit or seven (7) hours of continuing medical education (CME) credit. The course includes an optional posttest with 80% being the requirement for successful completion. AWHONN is accredited as a provider of continuing education in nursing by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation. AWHONN also holds a California BRN number: California CNE provider #CEP580. - 1.Describe physiologic principles of maternal and fetal oxygen transfer as they apply to principles of fetal heart monitoring.
- 2. Appraise the fetal response to maternal pathological and physiological adaptations during the labor process.
- 3. Analyze complex case studies and tracings using standardized terminology.
- 4. Apply perinatal risk management principles, communication techniques, and documentation strategies to complex and challenging patient care scenarios.
