### INTENDED AUDIENCE

Cardiologists, Surgeons, Internists/ Hospitalists, Family Practice Physicians, Physician Assistants, Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners, Advance Practice Nurses, Registered Nurses

### OBJECTIVES

- Discuss heart failure from the patient perspective
- Discuss the diagnostic strategies including genetic testing for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy

 Describe the genetic basis of cardiomyopathies, neuromuscular disorders, and pulmonary arterial hypertension
