Objectives

Upon completion of this symposium the learner should be able to:

- Identify patterns of neurologic involvement in patients with Sjogren's syndrome.
- Discuss the necessity for early screening of pulmonary hypertension in patients with connective tissue diseases, particularly in those with systemic sclerosis.
- Discuss the importance of early diagnosis of pulmonary hypertension.
- Explain the differential diagnosis of uveitis and which rheumatic diseases are most associated with it.
- Describe the management of a patient with uveitis.
- Discuss the role of computer-adaptive testing for clinical education.
- Analyze the role of random forest algorithms in augmenting bedside teaching and learning.
- Describe the relationship of scleritis to systemic inflammatory diseases.
- Summarize the differential diagnosis of orbital inflammation and its relationship to rheumatic diseases and list the ocular manifestations of systemic lupus.
- Describe recent advances in understanding clinical features and treatment modalities in patients with neuromyelitis-spectrum disease.
- Discuss the role of inflammasomes in triggering acute joint inflammation in patients with crystal-induced arthropathies.
- Discuss rare and unusual cases and side-effects to certain medications.
- Identify unusual rheumatologic diseases in patients.

General Information

Intended Audience

Physicians, nurse practitioners, physical therapists, occupational therapists and other arthritis health professionals.

Registration Fees

The fee is \$190 for physicians and \$115 for nurses and allied health care professionals.
