EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this program the learner should be able to:

- Detect common infectious complications of opioid abuse.
- Discuss updated adult immunization recommendations.
- Describe new approaches to diagnosis and treatment of several common community acquired infections.
- Discuss appropriate precautions designed to prevent patients from acquiring infection during travel.
- Interpret diagnostic test results for Lyme disease.
- Identify advances in hepatitis C virus (HCV) treatment and know when to screen for HCV infection.
- Discuss common complications of HIV infection and treatment.
- Identify infectious agents that can cause mononucleosis syndromes.
- Identify patients for whom screening and treatment of latent tuberculosis is recommended.
- Discuss diagnosis and treatment of common sexually-transmitted diseases in accordance with the latest guidelines.
- Compare adverse effects of commonly used antibiotics.
- Order appropriate tests to evaluate and manage patients with serious *Staphylococcus aureus* infections.
- Assess complex infectious disease problems using a case-based format.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Purpose

This course is designed for primary care physicians, including specialists in family practice, internal medicine, and pediatrics; clinical microbiologists; pharmacists, nurses; and individuals in training for these careers.

Lectures and interactive workshops will provide an update on the current, state-of-the-art diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases that commonly arise in adults and/or children in the community and which would routinely be encountered by primary care physicians in the Midwest.

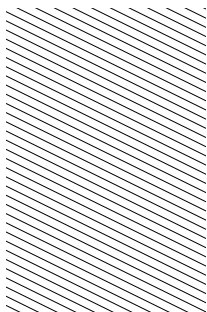
