# Objectives

To educate Iowa's health care providers about the importance of providing culturally responsive and competent care, to improve access to quality health care, and to reduce health disparities.

All personnel who provide health care services to diverse populations, including physicians, nurses, social workers, physician assistants, pharmacists, public health professionals, dentists, health educators, health administrators, and health science students.

# General Information

## Registration Fees

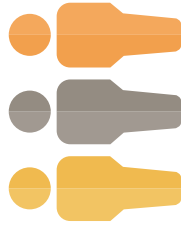
