COURSE DESCRIPTION

This conference is designed for practitioners, residents, and physician assistants in Urology, Family Medicine, and Nephrology. The course is designed to cover a wide variety of urologic disease from infancy to adulthood. Urologic diseases affect a large portion of the population and this course is designed to give a broad overview of the contemporary management of these patients.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Upon completing this conference, participants should be able to:

- Understand the complexity of genitourinary complications from external beam radiation therapy.
- Explain the differences between various BPH treatments and why one technology/therapy may be better than another.
- Discuss indications for various treatments for urinary incontinence following intervention for prostate cancer.
- Understand the process for technology development and how new ideas are brought to market.
- Review the current guidelines for diagnosis and treatment of lower urinary tract infection and overactive bladder.
